Using Educational Technology in Educational Settings

Today's students live in the information age and must be prepared for a rapidly changing global workforce. They must be problem-solvers and critical, independent thinkers.

Students must also possess the ability to organize and evaluate information, construct knowledge, communicate globally, direct their own learning, and solve real world problems.

In this online summer course, instructional technology specialist, Lori Weider, will teach K-12 teachers of all content areas how to empower students with twenty-first century skills by integrating educational technologies into their classrooms. Participants will:

- Upgrade personal technology literacy
- Brainstorm solutions to personal and classroom technology challenges
- Create individual learning plans for technology integration
- Discover the difference between technology to *automate* and technology to *informate*
- Examine techniques for differentiated instruction and classroom management

Participants will use the instructor's customized technology integration web site, which scaffolds the course and provides a variety of materials, tutorials and resources. Participants will also create lesson plans or units and develop support materials for integrating technology into the classroom.
