Located in downtown Vancouver on the West Coast of Canada, ECI's main campus is on Granville Island, an award-winning site of urban renewal. ECI has a culturally diverse student body of approximately 1600 students from across Canada and the world enrolled in studies leading to Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Fine Arts, Media Arts, and Design.

Emily Carr Institute is actively searching for a full-time faculty member with demonstrated ability and experience in teaching both traditional and digital print media. The candidate is an active practicing artist able to work with a range of print media including strength and expertise working with book forms. The candidate is also able to consider and teach visual arts in its broad social and cultural contexts and with a demonstrated interest in collaboration, new technologies and critical approaches to art as a contemporary, cross-disciplinary practice. The selected candidate will provide instruction to students at all levels including graduate studies, be an active participant in the Institute community, and will be expected to take a leading role in developing the program and generating a vision for the future of the area.

Candidates should have a Master of Fine Arts or equivalent degree, and a minimum of two years of related post-secondary teaching experience plus a distinguished record of artistic practice. This may include exhibition, production, publication, and other related activities.

Letters of application should address the candidate's expertise in the areas of teaching, pedagogical philosophy, professional work and community service, including a philosophy or approach to teaching within culturally diverse communities (maximum 500 word letter). The applicant should include a current curriculum vitae, images of work (20 maximum), and, if relevant, copies of theoretical writing or critical publications. Submissions should include the names, addresses and telephone numbers of three people from whom letters of reference can be obtained commenting on the candidate's experience and professional status.
