



STUDENTS LEARNING A MESSAGE -- PROGRAM RULES

You must be at the UMD Campus Center bus stop NO later than 5:30 pm. If it is cold, wait inside the campus center and watch for the UMD Dart Van. A UMD Police Officer will escort you in the Dart Van to the Dartmouth House of Correction for this program in which you will observe life in jail and speak with inmates imprisoned due in part to the consequences of alcohol/drug abuse, weapons use/possession, assault and violence.

PROPER DRESS - No shorts, tank tops, half-shirts, open-toed shoes, or overly baggy clothes. All shirts must be tucked in. There is only one layer of clothing allowed.

NO VALUABLES - An unlocked room will be provided for coats. Pocketbooks, book bags and valuables should be left at home.

NO METAL - No metal of any kind is allowed. This includes coins, hair clips, belts, jewelry (earrings, nose rings, belly button rings) etc. To save time, please remove these objects before entering the facility. If not removed in advance, you will be required to remove them before entering the facility. Eyeglasses necessary to see and metal teeth braces are permitted.

GOOD BEHAVIOR - The Dartmouth House of Correction has strict rules that must be followed. There will be no joking, laughing, or "horsing around". You must be able to follow instructions and pay attention. Inmates may confront you if you are not paying attention. Anyone who is unable to do so will be escorted from the facility.

NO CIGARETTES - Cigarettes are banned from the property. Smoking will not be allowed in the Dart Van.

NO WEAPONS - Any kind of weapon, even a pocketknife, is forbidden.

NO DRUGS - Absolutely no drugs of any kind are allowed, including prescription medication.

FOOD/DRINK - There are no opportunities to eat or drink anything while in the facility.

RESTROOMS - You will have limited access to restrooms. Please use the restroom before you enter the facility.

EVALUATION - In order to receive credit for participating in this program, you must complete a program feedback form and return it to the UMD Police Officer escorting you through the program. This is your opportunity to help make this program better for your fellow students.

SAFETY - Please help to insure your safety by following the above rules and any instructions given by Dartmouth House of Correction personnel.
