The twin concepts, Pravratti (P; engagement/projection) and Nivratti (N; disengagement/retraction) pervade all aspects of Hindu thought. According to the Hindu world-view, space and time move in P-N cycles. We will see how the concepts of P and N permeate Hindu cosmology, eschatology, sacred literature, and history. It is important to understand that Hinduism is currently in a P period; a period of expansion of domain and influence after a dismal N period that lasted several centuries. We will talk about the very foundations of the Vedantic world-view and show how P-N cycles fit within the broader structure of Hindu thought.

Suresh K. Shenoy, Ph.D., is an engineer by profession, employed by a multinational company in the area of the dynamic simulation of power systems. He received his B. Tech from the Indian Institute of Technology, Chennai, and his PhD in Engineering from the University of Florida. Suresh is a member of the board of directors of the Connecticut Council for Inter-Religious Understanding (CCIU). He lectures on Hindu thought at Quinnipiac University and in various other forums: classrooms, churches, conferences, and Hindu groups. He has authored numerous articles on the Hindu vision and takes special interest in Advaita Vedanta (non-dualistic Vedanta).

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
