

NINETEENTH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF VEDANTA

University of Massachusetts Dartmouth, MA

July 28-31, 2010

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International Congress of Vedanta, founded in 1986 in the Department of Philosophy at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, now is located in the Center for Indic Studies, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth. The Vedanta Congress will continue to be the Program Planner for the future conferences but the organizational details of the conference will be handled in the Center for Indic Studies of Univ. of Massachusetts Dartmouth.

For over two decades, International Congress of Vedanta is the focal point for meeting of scholars specializing in all aspects of Indian philosophy and religion. In the past, the Congress has also celebrated the birth centennial of S. Radhakrishnan (1988), the 1200 anniversary of Sri Sankaracharya (1990), the centennial of Swami Vivekananda's sojourn to America and his participation in the World Parliament of Religions (1992), birth centennial of J. Krishnamurti (1995), and the 700 anniversary of sanjeevan samadhi of Sri Jnaneswara (1996). International Vedanta Conferences were also held in Madras, Rishikesh, Hyderabad and Visakhapatnam in India, and in Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, in order to facilitate better interaction between scholars in India and the West.

Call for Papers and Panels

Interested scholars and academics are requested to send their proposal(s) for presentations at the Nineteenth International Congress of Vedanta.

Proposals for presentation should include title, author(s) name, affiliation, and a brief abstract of less than 500 words.

In addition, scholars can submit proposals for panels on themes of your interest. The Organizing Committee has proposed that scholars consider organizing panels with 5-10 speakers on a theme.

The panel seeks to explore issues like encoding mechanisms, standards, data storage, cross platform portability & exchange leading to effective interlinked search for the texts of Vedic tradition.

6. **A Critical Review of Status of Knowledge in Vedanta** - Professor R.P.Singh, Professor K. Srinivas, Dr. Alka Saharan, Dr. R.N.Jha, Dr. S.K.Shukla

A brief summary of the panel: Vedanta accepts all the pramanas of knowledge alongwith strong hermeneutic tradition. The three sources of Vedanta; namely, principal Upanishads, Gita and Brahmsutra Bhasya will be examined. Different commentaries at different stages will be analyzed. The status of knowledge , metaphysics, ethics, hermeneutics, etc. will be specially focused.

A brief summary of the panel : With Vedanta's emphasis on experiential knowledge (as opposed to knowledge of an object), psychology is critically placed to bridge the chasm between science and spirituality. Modern brain imaging tools offer a fascinating opportunity to understand how awareness, attention, and consciousness interact in an individual and how the plasticity of the brain can be harnessed to achieve peace and fulfillment.
