PROVIDENCE - A panel discussion on conflicts in India between Hindus and Muslims will be held tonight at 7 in Carmichael Auditorium at Brown University. The program is free and open to the public.

The discussion is sponsored by the Southern New England chapter of the Council of United India Organizations in association with the Muslim Heritage Council and the South Asia Student Association at Brown.

The sponsors said the discussion is aimed at improving the relationship between Hindus and Muslims.
