



Diana I. Lurie, Ph.D., C.A.P. is a Professor of Neuropharmacology in the Skaggs School of Pharmacy, at the University of Montana. She received her Ph.D. in Neuroscience from the University of Pennsylvania and then completed a postdoctoral fellowship at the University of Washington. Dr. Lurie joined the faculty at the University of Montana in 1995 where she teaches courses in Neuroscience, Anatomy and Physiology, and Ayurveda and directs a research laboratory. Her research areas include central nervous system (CNS) injury and repair, auditory development, the role of Pb in the

developing brain and the cellular response of the nervous system to ayurvedic herbs traditionally used to treat CNS disorders. Dr. Lurie recently completed training in Ayurvedic Wellness in both the U. S. and India and combines biomedical science with Ayurveda in her teaching and her research activities.
