Designed to extend a helping hand to the community by selecting those who have less of an opportunity to receive adequate education.

Objective: To educate the lesser advantaged in a workshop program designed to teach the basic skills required to operate computers and the programs contained in the Microsoft Office suite.

Solution: Using a mostly hands-on approach to learning, with handouts of study materials to review key points, the instructors provided the inmates with a solid foundation on the basics of operating a computer and the programs that comprise Microsoft Office.

- Project coordinators focused their educational efforts on Microsoft Office.
- A challenging, yet user friendly lesson plan was developed, one that would be effective for individuals of various skill levels.

We tailored the class to accommodate 2 groups



- •The students were given the same evaluation at the end of the course.




