  - ∠ Use microphone for questions and comments
- Approval of November minutes
  - - No amendments, additions, or oppositions Motion approved
- President's Report (Brian Ayotte)
  - ⊄ Special elections Nominations are closed, and elections are now open

  - ⊄ Request for committees to meet as soon as possible & schedule their meetings for spring semester
- Committee Reports
  - ∠ Library Committee (Sara Pike)
    - Committee met twice this semester
    - Library has crafted a new mission statement and finalizing its value statements
    - Goals:
      - Implementation of an institutional repository
        - Process started last year with review of available software & selection of software
        - Soft launch of repository in early February

- Review of library policies and procedures considering new mission and values
- Development of communication plan to share impact and availability of library resources and materials
- Projects
  - Review and potential survey of faculty regarding library-related tutorials
  - Monitor the issue of library staffing
- ∠ Policy & Process Review Committee (Lorraine Heffernan)
  - Did not meet this semester; last meet in March 2024
    - Will schedule meetings for spring 2025
  - This year's tasks
    - Looking at incomplete policies across the UMass campuses
- Invited Guests
  - ∠ Update on Microsoft Authenticator (Holger Dippel)
    - Only about 50% of users migrated to Authenticator by the deadline
      - Force migrated the remaining 50%
    - Ability to Remember for 30 days has been added at log in
      - Like Duo had
    - Safety recommendations
      - Register multiple methods of authentication
      - Lock your computer when you are not at your desk
      - Only respond to Authenticator when you are logging in
        - If you receive a request to authenticate and you are not logging in, then it is likely a scammer
    - Monitoring activity
      - Ability to selectively prompt specific user groups for authentication

  - - Posted on myCourses for comments and discussion
      - Changes offered by Chad McGuire were reviewed and mostly accepted
    - Review of the proposed process in detail
      - Background: Proposal by Grant O'Rielly and Cathy Curran several years ago & developed further by the Steering and By-Laws Committees
      - Goal: Fair and deliberative process
        - Serves as measure of last resort
        - Provides enough time within the process to resolve issues
        - o Involves both the Senate and affected faculty

- Motion to move the proposed process forward made (Grant O'Rielly) and seconded (Doug Roscoe)
  - Motion to add /Library to the definition of eligible units (Chad McGuire) and seconded
    - Vote: Yes: majority, Abstain: 2, No: 0 Motion passes
  - Motion to add language that the Steering Committee must certify no later than 28 calendar days after receipt of petition made (Meghan Fair) and seconded
    - O Vote: Yes: majority, Abstain: 1, No: 0 Motion passes
  - Robust discussion
  - Motion to postpone the vote to a meeting, at which time more information is gathered about confidentiality of the process made (Doug Roscoe) and seconded (Erin Bromage)
    - Vote: Yes: Majority, Abstain: 1, No: 0 Motion passes

      - Opportunity to understand how things are going and how to offer support

  - ∠ Working on offering a Provost Faculty Fellows Program opportunity for faculty to work directly with the Provost's Office

    - Mid-semester Progress Report results impactful for students
    - Mid-semester satisfaction survey results
  - ∠ Update on student success initiatives

  - - New Student Code of Conduct
      - Instill accountability and respect in our students
      - Work to create a more seamless process where students feel heard and valued
      - Overview of changes

- Student Activities Fee
  - Dartmouth and Boston campuses had the lowest fees
  - First fee increase in 5 years
  - Breakdown of the fee distribution to the various student organizations
  - Fees distributed by the Student Fee Allocation Committee
- CARES program referral
  - All referrals should receive a confirmation of the referral
  - Discussion about reporting and Title IX where students view referrals as harassment, discrimination, or retaliation
