2017-2018 RECENT GRADUATES SURVEY AY 2017-2018 graduate alumni

Key Findings:

- About 79% of AY 2018 graduate alumni were employed three months after graduation.
- The full-time employment rate for AY 2018 graduate alumni three months after graduation was 65.6%.*
- 19.1% of AY 2018 graduate alumni were pursuing further education three months after graduation. Another 29.8% planned to pursue additional education at some point.



THE SURVEY

Approximately three months following the completion of their studies, 571 alumni who had earned their graduate degree or certificate during the 2017-2018 academic year (AY 2018) were asked to participate in an online survey about their employment and educational activities since graduation (note: Law students were excluded because the Law School has specific standards for alumni follow-ups). Graduate alumni were invited to participate in the survey through a series of five email communications (a prenotice, an invitation, and three reminders). Overall, 112 graduate alumni responded to the survey (a response rate of 19.6%). This brief details the principal findings from the survey (note: percentages are based on the number of alumni responding to the relevant survey items).

EMPLOYMENT OUTCOMES

- 78.6% of AY 2018 graduate alumni were employed three months after graduation.
 - The majority of those employed (65.6%) were working full-time.
 - The majority of those employed (74.3%) were in a permanent position.
 - Less than half were employed in a position that they did not work at while at UMass Dartmouth (48.6%)
- 22.9% of AY 2018 graduate alumni were not employed three months after graduation and were seeking employment. No graduate alumni (0%) were unemployed and were not seeking employment.
- The full-time employment rate for AY 2018 graduate alumni three months after graduation was 65.6%.*
- 98.6% of AY 2018 graduate alumni who were employed indicated that their job was "somewhat" or "highly related" to their graduate program.
 - More than half of those employed (74.3%) indicated that their job was "highly related" to their graduate program.
 - Additionally, 50.0% of those employed specified that a graduate degree was required as a condition of their employment.
- Among AY 2018 graduate alumni who were employed, 64.9% were working in Massachusetts.
- The average annual reported gross salary for AY 2018 graduate alumni working fulltime was \$60,419 (median: \$58,400).

The most frequently cited occupational groups by AY 2018 graduate alumni who were employed:

- Management, Business, and Financial Operations Occupations (18.7%)
- 2. Education, Training, and Library Occupations (17.3%)
- Healthcare Practitioners, Support, and Technical Occupations (13.3%)
- 4. Computer and Mathematical Occupations (12.0%)
- Architecture and Engineering
 Occupations & Office and
 Administrative Support Occupations
 (6.7%)

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

- Overall, 19.1% of AY 2018 graduate alumni were engaged in further educational pursuits three months after graduation. Almost a third (29.8%) were not currently pursuing further education but planned to do so at some point.
- More than one-third of those engaged in further education were pursuing a Ph.D. or Ed.D (33.3%). Others were pursuing Master's degrees (61.1%) or some other type of advanced credential (5.6%).
- An equal percentage (38.9%) of those engaged in further education indicated that
 their main reason for pursuing an advanced certificate or degree was because it
 would allow them to advance in their chosen career path and because another
 advanced certificate/degree will broaden their professional options beyond their
 current career path. 11.1% indicated another advanced certificate/degree was
 required for their chosen career and another 11.1% wanted to update or improve
 job skills though not required nor necessarily will advance their career.

76.6% of AY 2018 graduate alumni rated their entire educational experience at UMassD as "good" or "excellent."

76.6% also indicated that they would "probably" or "definitely" go to UMassD again for graduate studies if they could start over.

Degree fields of AY 2018 graduate alumni who were pursuing further education included:

- Business, Management, and Marketing (33.3%)
- Public Administration and Social Service
 & Other (16.7%)
- Education (11.1%)
- Engineering, & Social Sciences (5.6%)
