

2020-2021 RECENT GRADUATES SURVEY AY 2020-2021 graduate alumni

Key Findings:

- Over 82%* of AY 2021 graduate alumni respondents were employed three months after graduation.
- About 97%** of AY 2020-2021 graduate alumni were employed \underline{or} engaged in further educational pursuits .
- The full-time employment rate for AY 2021 graduate alumni respondents three months after graduation was 78.3% **
- 11.7% of AY 2021 graduate alumni respondents were pursuing further education three months after graduation. Another 36.2% planned to pursue additional education at some point.

THE SURVEY

Approximately three months following the completion of their studies, 526 alumni who had earned their graduate degree or certificate during the 2020-2021 academic year (AY 2021) were asked to participate in an online survey about their employment and educational activities since graduation (note: Law students were excluded because the Law School has specific standards for alumni follow-ups). Graduate alumni were invited to participate in the survey through a series of five email communications (a prenotice, an invitation, and three reminders). Overall, 163 graduate alumni responded to the survey (a response rate of 31.0%). This brief details the principal findings from the survey (note: percentages are based on the number of alumni responding to the relevant survey items).

EMPLOYMENT OUTCOMES

- 82.2%* of AY 2021 graduate alumni were employed three months after graduation.
- 96.9%** of AY 2021 graduate alumni were employed, of those who were employed or seeking employment.
 - The majority of those employed (94.0%) were working full-time.
 - The majority were employed in a field/profession in which they desired to work (91.5%) with 84.1% indicating they were "very satisfied" or "satisfied" within their current position.
 - 38.0% were employed in a position at which they did not work while at UMass Dartmouth.
- 16.6% of AY 2021 graduate alumni were not employed three months after graduation and were seeking employment. The other graduate alumni (1.2%) stated they were unemployed and were not seeking employment.
- \bullet The full-time employment rate for AY 2021 graduate alumni three months after graduation was 78.3%.*
- 96.6% of AY 2021 graduate alumni who were employed indicated that their job was "somewhat" or "highly related" to their graduate program.
 - Over two thirds of those employed (70.3%) indicated that their job was "highly related" to their graduate program.
 - Additionally, 35.5% of those employed specified that a graduate degree was required as a condition of their employment.
- Among AY 2021 graduate alumni who were employed, 61.3% were working in Massachusetts.
- The average annual reported gross salary for AY 2021 graduate alumni working full-time was \$69,756 (median: \$64,000).

The most frequently cited occupational groups by AY 2021 graduate alumni who were employed:**

- Education, Training, and Library Occupations (19.6%)
- Business and Financial Operations Occupations; Computer and Mathematical Occupations (14.0%)
- 3. Management Occupations (9.3%)
- 4. Healthcare Practitioners & Technical Occupations (8.4%)
- 5. Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations (7.5%)

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

- Overall, 11.7% of AY 2021 graduate alumni were engaged in further educational pursuits three months after graduation. More than a third (36.2%) were not currently pursuing further education but planned to do so at some point.
- Half of those engaged in further education were pursuing a Ph.D. or Ed.D (26.7%). Others were pursuing Master's degrees (60.0%) or some other type of advanced credential (13.3%).
- Almost half (42.9%) of those engaged in further education indicated that their main reason for pursuing an advanced certificate or degree was because another advanced certificate/degree will allow them to advance within their current career path. Approximately another third of those taking part in further education (28.6%) specified they wanted to pursue a personal interest in a subject or it was the best available option at the time.

86.5% of AY 2021 graduate alumni rated their entire educational experience at UMassD as "good" or "excellent."

85.9% also indicated that they would "probably" or "definitely" go to UMassD again for graduate studies if they could start over.
