Recommended in senior year; may be waived in lieu of a study abroad of at least 4-weeks duration plus any upper- division course in PSC. 3 Internship credits are required, up to 15 Internship credits may be earned.	
☐ PSC 305 POLITICAL SCIENCE INTERNSHIP	
Specialized Courses	
☐ 7 courses above the PSC 100-level, not including PSC 349 and PSC 305	
☐ A <u>maximum</u> of 2 of these 7 courses can be completed at PSC 200-level	
☐ A minimum of 2 of these 7 courses must be completed at PSC 400-level	
☐ Upper division courses (PSC 300+) must be taken in a minimum of 2 of the 4 main subfields:	
American Politics/Policy; Comparative Politics; International Relations; Political Theory	
☐ 1 non-Western course in any department (can also count toward other degree requirements)
