Examination Conflicts: A student who has an “examination conflict,” as defined in the *UMass Law Student Handbook* § 16(d) (iii), is entitled to have one of the examinations rescheduled. There is an examination conflict when a student has two or more final examinations scheduled to start fewer than sixteen hours apart. For example, if you have exams scheduled at 6:30 p.m. on Monday and 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, you have an examination conflict. If you have exams scheduled at 1:30 p.m. on Monday and 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, you do not have an examination conflict.

If you have an examination conflict, you must **submit a petition within two weeks of the close of the published add and drop period or the publication date of an exam schedule revision that creates a conflict for you, whichever occurs later**. If you do not file a timely petition, you will be deemed to have waived your right to object to the conflict.
