**Distance Education Limits:** Students may not earn more than 10 credits in distance education courses during their first 30 credits of J.D. study. Students may earn no more than 30 credits in distance education courses during their entire J.D. program. **During summer 2021, only LAW 542, LAW 629, and LAW 710 count as distance education courses.**

#### **Summer Registration Requirements:**

- No student may take more than six credit hours during the summer session without prior written approval of the Associate Dean. No student may take more than nine credit hours during the summer session under any circumstances. (Student Handbook § 8)
- Students who have not completed a year of full-time study or its equivalent (24 credits) may enroll only in those summer classes that are designated [1L] as being open to them.
