Articulation Agreement of Academic Programs

between

Cape Cod Community College and University of Massachusetts Dartmouth

Objectives:

- To attract qualified students to Cape Cod Community College and University of Massachusetts Dartmouth.
- 2. To promote and facilitate an efficient transition of transfer students between institutions.
- 3. To provide specific information and guidelines for transfer students.
- 4. To encourage academic coordination and cooperation, including curricular reviews, on-site visits, and joint academic advising for students attending Cape Cod Community College.

Stipulations:

- 1. This agreement applies to transfer students with an Associate of Science in Nursing and Registered Nurse licensure in the state they reside.
- 2. Cape Cod Community College graduates who successfully completed the courses noted in this agreement (or their updated equivalents) may transfer up to 45 nursing portfolio credits upon successful enrollment in UMass Dartmouth's RN-BS online degree program. These credits coupled with the transfer of non-nursing credits from the CCCC associate degree in nursing, results in a cumulative total up to 76 transfer credits applied to the BS in Nursing program at UMass Dartmouth.

Mutual Responsibilities:

- 1. Both institutions agree to maintain current listings of the course equivalencies. This will be the responsibility of the two designated representatives.
- 2. Cape Cod Community College and University of Massachusetts Dartmouth will incorporate a summary of this agreement into official publications and web sites.
- 3. Cape Cod Community College and University of Massachusetts Dartmouth agree to encourage qualified students to participate in this program by providing information, advising and other assistance required to foster a seamless transition from the two-year institution to the four-year institution.

Review/Revision:

1. Both institutions will periodically review this agreement. Substantive changes in the courses or program of either institution will require the replacement of this agreement with an updated version. In such case, the parties agree to terminate this Agreement on one year's notice and to replace with an updated agreement.

These credits along with the 31 non-nursing credits result in a cumulative total of 76 transfer credits toward UMass Dartmouth's BS in Nursing degree.
