3. Earn a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average on transferrable credit from all previous institutions. Please note that Engineering, Biology, Chemistry, and Medical Laboratory Science majors require a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.7. Students with a cumulative grade point average of 3.25 or higher qualify to receive a merit scholarship. 4. Submit a complete International Application with official copies of all transcripts at [www.umassd.edu/apply/](http://www.umassd.edu/apply/).
5. Adhere to the University of Massachusetts, Dartmouth's deadlines for application and document submission, and admission policies.
6. Upon full admission, submit all required documents for F-1 student status and SEVIS transfer.
